

- Reading nonfiction and literary texts




- 2. Showing the cover, the author and the illustrator

Big Ear

1. Practicing phonemic awareness 2. Steps: (1) The teacher reads a word (2) Students spell out the word (3) The teacher picks one student to spell out the word. (4) explain the meaning of the word 3. If students have difficulty The teacher rereads in chunks


Big Ear

- 1. Practicing reading ability
- 2. Steps:
 - (1) Reading the descriptions
 - (2) Writing down the answer
 - (3) Checking the answer
- 3. Arouse student's curiosity

Special Mark


- 1. Practicing phonics
- The teacher draws a special mark on specific letters.










Stuck on a word? Try these reading strategies!

Pasting in the classroom

- Catchy slogan
- Brief instruction
- Clear steps





Bird's Eye

Look at the pictures! Look at the pictures for clues to help you figure out the word.

Lips the Fish

Get Your Lips Ready!

Say the first few sounds of the word out loud.
Read to the end of the sentence and say the sounds again.

"S-t-r-e-t-c-h" it out!

Stretch"

-Stretch the word out slowly. -Put the sounds together to figure out the word.

Chunky Monkey

 -Look for a "chunk" that you know (-ing, -and, -art, -old, etc.).
 -Look for a word part (be-, -er, etc.)



Skip It, Skip It! -Skip the word ("skip it, skip it") -Read to the end of the sentence. -"Hop back" and read it, read it.


Tryin' Lion

Try It Again!

Try to reread the sentence.
Try a word that makes sense.

When you can't go on...

Ask for Help! After you have tried all of the other strategies, ask for help.
