ACCELERATED READER PHILOSOPHY

- The Accelerated Reader (AR) program has been around since 1986 and it is the most popular and successful reading product that promotes reading from pre-kindergarten through 12th grade.
- The AR program offers students reading books at an optimum level for advancement based on their tested reading level. The level assignment helps kids choose the right books and the tests provide feedback on the student's progress. AR books are evaluated and assigned a reading level and corresponding points depending on the level of difficulty of the sentences, vocabularies and the length of the book.
