

## 台教師培訓取經 獲洛縣表揚

18名新北市教師體驗美式教學與生活 特別是雙語教育 獲益良多

洛杉磯縣縣政委員安東諾維奇 (Michael D. Antonovich) 日在洛杉磯市中心韓肯尼斯漢廣場 (Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration)，表揚18名從台灣新北市來洛參培訓的教師和校長。

這18名教師和校長是從台灣新北市經過選拔，代表新北市國小來參加洛縣與新北市友誼城市的教師交流。

教師團領隊、新北市竹圍國小校長胡俊豪表示，教師團在美兩周期間，在洛杉磯Elliott成人學校完成一周的教學課程，隨後一周在Stowers小學參訪。

胡俊豪說，此行主要讓教師感受美國當地文化，學習雙語教育 (ESL) 教學。胡俊豪表示，為了讓教師瞭解主流社會，還安排團員住在居民家中，從飲食起居等日常生活感受不同的文化氛圍。

胡俊豪說，此行感到美國、台灣教育最大的不同，是美國教師「包辦」更徹底。胡俊豪說，美國小學注重語言和數學，只在下午穿插自然和社會學科。台灣小學教育的科目的分得更細，責任教師多，學習時間長，基礎

教育課程豐富，教學質量不輸美國，甚至比美國更優。

參加此次交流的教師認同胡俊豪觀點。她們表示，來美前覺得美國孩子功課輕鬆，考試不多。來了才知道，美國孩子課業壓力也很重，但小學教育比較偏科，台灣國小課程更豐富。

國小教師江孟濟表示，此行最大收穫在學習到美國教師豐富多樣、富創意的課堂組織。江孟濟說，譬如學生排隊，美國的教師不按照第一組到第三組的順序，而是要求不同顏色或款式服裝的小朋友依次排隊。江孟濟表示，將把美國教師這種思維運用到英語課堂中。

教師張馨云表示，美國學生自制和禮貌，逃課或頑皮的學生不多，教師不用大聲呵斥也能維持課堂秩序，這可能和文化及家庭教育有關。她表示，怎樣訓練學生，還需要一段時間觀察。

洛杉磯縣和台北縣友誼委員會主席張曼君表示，該委員會1996年成立，主要是文化、教育及商業交流。教師培訓項目於2006年成立，2007年第一批教師訪美，4月團去中部城市，10月團來洛杉磯，至今已是第四次交流培訓。

## California - 51<sup>st</sup> Worst State in the Country.

Huh?

According to a recent study by Chief Executive Magazine, California ranked as the 51<sup>st</sup> worst state in the country to do business. (*District of Columbia*)

So what, right? Well, not so fast. Here's a little Economics lesson (*one that your Professor's probably missed teaching*)

Taxes come from the Private Sector of the economy, through primarily (3) sources: Income, Business, and Sales Taxes. Businesses and "rich people" are fluid. If you penalize(tax) production, businesses and workers will find less oppressive environments to setup shop.


**We do not have a revenue problem – we have a spending problem.**
