

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SIOP TERMINOLOGY



SIOP Model = the lesson planning and delivery system



SIOP protocol = the instrument used to observe, rate, and provide feedback on lessons

 Based on many research projects to develop an accurate model of sheltered instruction


A guide

- To integrate language develops with content areas







1. Shared Reading (20-30 min)

Teachers work with whole class and choose a text book, a smart board, a copied article, or a big book as a shard reading text.









3. Independent Reading (15-20 min)

According to Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE)

- A time set aside for students
- Students read an appropriate, self-selected text
- Teachers become observers to monitor students' choices of reading materials
- Work with a peer or independently







4. Read Aloud (15-20 min)

- > Teachers read to students
- ➤ Materials fit students' listening levels
- > Students can hear rich language of stories.
- Using think aloud skill to model reading strategy



5. Word Study (15-20 min)


- --Sight word instruction
- --Using strategies: context clues, root words, and affixes


6. Daily Writing(25-30 min)

Use various methods








