**Introduction:**

**Sanxia Old Street & Blue Dyeing**

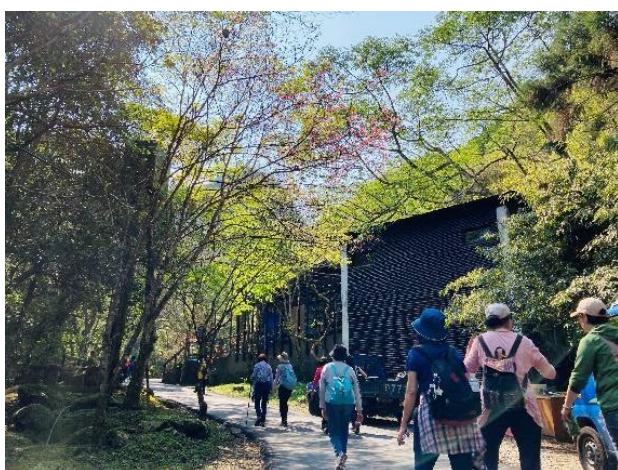
Sanxia Old Street spans over 200 meters, lined with over 100 heritage shopfronts. The façade designs are not lavish but feature historic aesthetics, creating an atmosphere reminiscent of a century ago. Once the bustling heart of Sanxia and a significant hub for the blue-dyeing industry in northern Taiwan, the street’s glory faded over time. Determined to preserve its cultural heritage, local residents



spearheaded a comprehensive restoration in 2004. By 2007, the old street had been revitalized, blending original architectural styles with unique renovations.

Today, Sanxia Old Street hosts not only restored architecture but also vibrant industries, including blue-dyeing and traditional crafts. Visitors can stroll along the historic alleys, hear stories of the past, and experience a nostalgic journey into the charm of Taiwan’s past.

**Manyueyuan Forest Recreation Area**



Within the Sanxia’s district area of Rueizai Creek, there sits a lovely haven with waterfalls, ecology, and red maples known as the Manyueyuan (Full Round Moon) National Forest Recreation Area. Its climate is cool and humid throughout the year, which cultivates a rich fern ecology. Though there once used to be a small-scale logging business in the area, the neatly-arranged manmade forest seen today serves as a testimony to Taiwan’s desire to preserve its rich ecology.

The recreation area also boasts a rich ecology of avifauna, amphibians, and butterflies. Manyueyuan Waterfall and Chu’nu (Virgin) Waterfall at the end of the hiking trail are two

major attractions of the recreational area. Standing on Manyue Bridge, you will see the Manyueyuan Waterfall with the upper part concealed behind one big stone wall about ten meters tall, and hear the thunder of the cascading water as it explodes off the rocks. The Virgin Waterfall, on the other hand, is more graceful and gentle. Light refracts and dances amidst the mist in broad daylight causing spectacular rainbows to be revealed around the waterfall from time to time.

### **Official Leave**

- Participation in the first and second day training is a requirement that will affect foreign teacher's final evaluation. Attendance is required.
- Teachers who choose not to participate in the third-day event must remain on campus for classes or office work.
